Update

- **SRTR data request**
 - Assess the feasibility of including utilization as a modeled outcome for pancreas allocation
- **Medical urgency guidelines**
 - The decision was made to include impaired awareness of hypoglycemia as the clinical consideration
- **Efficiency discussions**
 - The Committee intends to address logistics related to procurement of pancreata

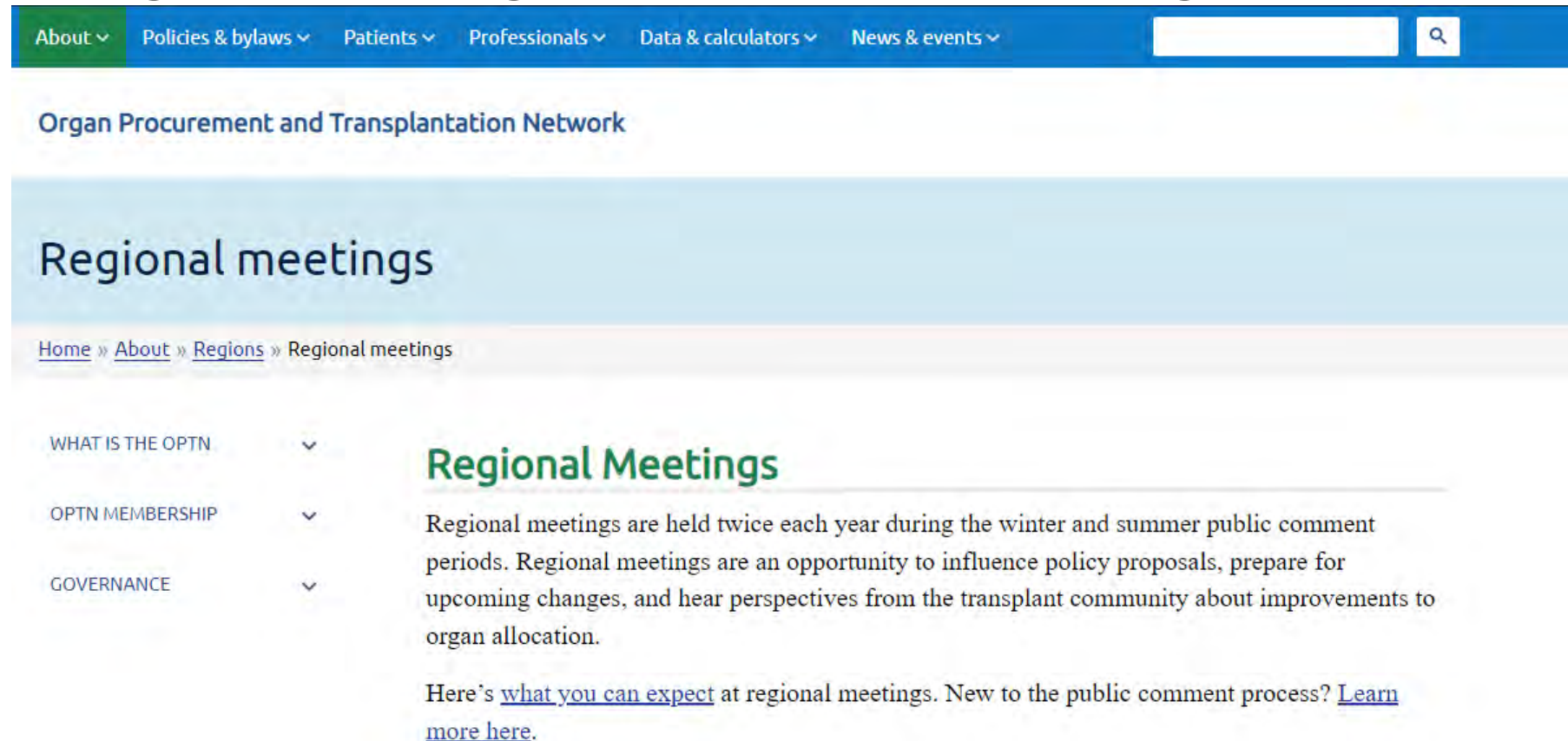
